Dear myClass students,

The myClass team has had some nice holiday time, but we've also been busy making some improvements to our Adult programme and we have lots of exciting news for our myClass students in Ho Chi Minh City this term.

Most importantly, of course, is the closure of the British Council offices at 25 Le Duan, and the opening of our new main office and myClass centre in the modern Viettel building in Cach Mang Thang Tam. We hope you have had a chance to join some classes there already and that you have experienced the great new facilities.

Secondly, we have a new Adult Courses Coordinator joining the team. Preston is not new to the British Council or to Vietnam and joined us from our Hanoi office this summer. He speaks Vietnamese really well but may need your help adjusting to the Saigon accent.

Thirdly, we have been thinking hard about new ways to support you in getting the most out of myClass and making faster progress. In other exciting developments, we have responded to your feedback on assessment, as well as the need to practise writing more, and we will be introducing two improvements to the assessment system: one for Speaking, where a change will ensure that more students get extended assessments; and the other for Writing, where students can submit written homework and receive feedback from a teacher. I hope you enjoy these new improvements to the myClass programme. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support and to remind you that we are always open to your feedback. Please do let us know what you think about the changes because your feedback really helps us to improve our service.

## **New to myClass in Vietnam**

We know how important it is for you to have clear information about your progress in English. That's why we are making some changes to how you will be assessed in myClass from September.

#### **New Writing Assessments**

Writing is a key part of communication in English, for work, for study, and for life in general. To help you better improve in this area we are launching a new system to provide you with more information about your progress in writing skills.

After attending a myClass writing lesson you will be able to submit a final draft of your writing to a team of British Council teachers who will give you specific feedback, correction and grades for your writing. For more information on how to submit writing work please see the 'Writing Submission Guide' which is available in centre or through the newsfeed on your myClass profile.

#### **Changes to Speaking Assessments**

Understanding your progress, strengths and areas to improve is a key part of your English journey. To ensure that you have the information you need to help you improve early in your myClass experience we are making some changes to our speaking assessment patterns. In September we'll be giving you extended assessments with grades and comments in or around your 10th/30th/50th lessons, and simple assessments with grades in or around your 20th/40th/60th lessons.



# Arts: Cultural and Creative Hubs Vietnam 2018–21

The British Council, in partnership with the Vietnam National Institute of Arts and Culture Studies, is pleased to announce **Cultural and Creative Hubs Vietnam**. To be implemented over three years from 2018 to 2021, the project receives financial support from the European Union.

A cultural and creative hub (CCH) is a place, physical or virtual, which brings people together to express artistic ideas and creativity in a free and open environment, and allows them to share a variety of artistic outputs with their communities. In Vietnam, most CCHs are independent arts and creative spaces, often led and managed by artists and creative practitioners. These organisations are important players in the culture sector, and have great potential for engaging in and supporting artistic expression and the access to cultural life.

# Education: Skills for employability

In a competitive emerging economy, young people need to prove they have the professional skills to succeed. Skills for employability is British Council's flagship programme for skills development and vocational education.

Our projects and partnerships are designed to improve young Vietnamese people's skills in gaining and maintaining employment, and developing entrepreneurial talent.

#### **Society: Climate change education**

The British Council is committed to playing an active role in raising awareness of climate change. In Vietnam we run climate change educational activities and work with secondary school teachers and students. This programme is aligned with Vietnam's national target programme to respond to climate change and Vietnam's Ministry of Education and Training's climate change objectives.

In 2012, this project was implemented in 25 secondary schools in Hanoi, Hai Phong, Quang Ninh, Da Nang and Ho Chi Minh City as part of the Connecting Classrooms network. By the end of 2012 the project was implemented in 300 primary schools in Hoa Binh province in partnership with the Ministry of Education and Training.
